### THE BLEND

Sandalwood • Neroli • Bergamot  
Sweet Marjoram • Camellia • Jojoba

### THE PAUSE

After bathing.  
Before sleep.  
Before stepping into something that asks more of you.

Massage into the soles of the feet.  
Across the lower back.  
Over the heart.

Let it settle before you rise.

## THE FOUNDATION OILS

Camellia was chosen for its lineage in Eastern skin traditions — pressed from seed and known for disappearing into the skin while leaving it supple and resilient.

Joboba mirrors the skin's own structure, balancing without weight.

Meadowfoam protects the composition, extending its life quietly.

Sunflower nourishes without gloss.

Nothing in this formula is ornamental. Everything serves the pause.

## ROOTED PROSPERITY

Prosperity, in its truest form, is not accumulation.

It is steadiness.

Solace was composed for the moments when growth requires grounding — when strength must be quiet and held rather than displayed.

Applied to the body, it becomes a pause you can feel.

Not to stop you. But to steady you.

## FINAL REFLECTION

Solace does not promise transformation.

It offers composure.

And composure is where growth begins.

## IN THE STILLROOM

Solace began with wood.

Sandalwood has long been used where breath meets stillness — in temples, in quiet rooms, in spaces where the body must soften before the mind can follow. Its scent lingers low and steady, reminding the body how to descend rather than brace.

Neroli comes from the blossom of bitter orange — a flower that blooms white and fragile, yet grows from thorned branches. It has been used for centuries to steady trembling and refine strength. Not to erase feeling — but to hold it gently.

Bergamot is sunlight held in peel. In traditional perfumery, it lifts without scattering. In the body, it creates space without urgency — brightness that does not pull you away from your ground.

Sweet Marjoram has long been carried when the body holds too tightly. It does not sedate. It persuades the muscles to soften.

This is how Solace was composed, from root upward.
